We have just finished up Unit 2 in Math in which we discussed the power of 10 and understanding our base 10 system of numbers.. Multiplying 2-digit numbers by 2-digit numbers and using multiples to help us solve division problems. We are moving into a study of Fractions. We will complete this unit in the first week of November.
